CELEBRITY BOXERS - LORD BYRON by Peter Hatton

IBRO Newsletter #8 listed some men who achieved fame outside of the boxing ring but who were known to have boxed. One of these men was the writer Lord Byron, born George Gordon Byron, the 6th Baron Byron (1788-1824). Peter Hatton provides some additional insight into Byron's boxing participation.

"In this period there is a great distinction between bare-fisted 'milling' and gloved 'sparring.' (ed. note - see p.47 of the Second Annual Journal). There is no evidence that Byron did other than spar. Jim Ford credits him with 6 bouts while at Harrow (School) (1801-5) and our Dictionary of National Biography credits him with having been 'a poor scholar, ... good boxer' at school and a 'practised boxer' while at Cambridge University (1805-08). Boxing was not a formal sport at Harrow school at that date and I will see if I can find out anything more; however, given Byron's reputation as a protector of his friends with his fists (esp. Lords Clare & Delawarr, Harkness, Long, Sinclair and (more debatably) the future prime-minister Peel), I suspect these were challenge fights informally controlled rather than anything more formal. When in London from at least 1805 to at least 1814, Byron was coached by 'Gentleman' John Jackson, 'Professor of Pugilism' (All-England Champion 1795-? 1800) at his gym at 13 Bond Street; at times Jackson also came round to Byron's rooms in the Albany to spar with him. I am sure Byron was a frequent spectator at the Fives Court, but had he participated in an exhibition, Pierce or Bee would have recorded it. Bee in Fancyiana lists Byron as one of the principal putters-up of purses in 1807. I suspect Byron's sparring at Cambridge was chiefly with Long and would have been watched by other undergraduates. My conclusion then is that Byron, though having a reputation for the use of his fists, never participated in a bout one could record formerly by the standards of 1800, 1890 or 1984."

"SHOWER" FIGHTS

In reading a fight report in a contemporary Australian boxing magazine, the phrase "shower fight" was noted. An inquiry to John Hogg produced the following explanation.

"A 'shower' fight results in shower of coins to the combatants as you may have surmised. Frequently notes also accompany the coins. Mainly preliminary bouts are showered, sort of a bonus to the lesser fighters for a good fight. Hard to say how common they are. Not as many as years ago when there were more preliminary fights on each programme. It's a dangerous practice but impossible to stop. A coin thrown from the back of the stadium can cause damage. I have seen ringsiders suffer head cuts from coins. In Melbourne years ago one lost the sight of an eye after being hit. When a shower starts you duck your head and cover your eyes."

NEW ZEALAND

Earlier this year, on March 19, 1984, Australian Tony Mundine lost his Australasian light heavyweight title to Samoan Alex Sua in Carlaw Park, Auckland, New Zealand. What made the bout unusual was the scoring of the three judges: 234-233, 234-232 and 234-228. In New Zealand they use the 20 point must scoring system for professional bouts as well as amateur ones. Does anyone know of any other place where a 20 point system is used for professional bouts? (thanks to John Hogg for this item).

BATTLING JIM JOHNSON

In newsletter #13, an article on Joe Jeannette mentioned that Battling Jim Johnson fought out of a "Jim Jeffries-type crouch in his heavyweight title bout with Jack Johnson." Robert Diamond has a short film clip of Jim Johnson vs. Sam McVea in 1910 in Paris in which Jim Johnson fights in a very pronounced upright position and wonders if Jim Johnson changed styles for his bout against Jack Johnson. He writes, "Interestingly, McVea fights with his left arm completely extended and uses it as a spear to charge with. Both fighters also have the unfortunate habit during a brisk exchange of punches of throwing round-house punches with their heads down and eyes facing the floor."

CELEBRITY BOXERS

In addition, the Peace Corps director under President Johnson in 1966, Jack Hood Vaughan, was a Michigan Golden Gloves champion.

TARTAN BOXING ANNUAL

Robert W. Macdonald, 29 Baronswell, Wick, Caithness, Scotland has produced a limited edition of a new record book, The Tartan Boxing Annual 1984. This 43 page softcover book contains the records of 45 Scottish boxers - their 5 world champions, 5 contenders who fought for the world's championship, 3 others who were European champions, and 32 current boxers. The book includes 4 additional bouts for Benny Lynch that are not in the 1983 RRB.

Distinction is made between bouts won by RSC, retirement, KO or injury, and the site of bouts held within Britain (Albert Hall, National S.C., etc.) is also given. An interesting note is the fact that flyweight Johnny Hill is included among the world champions by the RRB but not by this Scottish compiler.

BOXING - This is It!

Is the title of a new book by Hank Kaplan and Enrique Encinosa. GUINNESS BOOK OF WORLD RECORDS

Recently IBRO was asked to review the boxing entries for the Guinness Book of World Records. Included in the boxing section are facts about the longest and shortest fights, tallest fighter, most fights, most knockouts, etc.

As most members know, many of these so-called "facts" have been passed along in various record books but have not always been verified. The Guinness authors would like to be able to authenticate all entries and have asked IBRO to help. Please send any material that might be used in this task to IBRO, Box 84, Guilford, NY 13780. Any additional items of the greatest, fewest, most, least nature that can be authenticated are also desired. The Andy Bowen-Jack Burke and Jeffries-Finnegan clippings in newsletter #13 are good examples of what they are looking for.

YOUNGEST PROS

One record not yet included in the Guinness Book is that of youngest professional boxer. The November, 1969 issue of "The Ring", page 29, includes the following item:

"Canadian promoter Regis Levesque put a card together in Cap del la Madeleine, Quebec Province, in which his 12-year-old son Daniel made his pro debut in a losing effort against another 12-year-old, Jacques Noel. The bout consisted of three two-minute rounds. The boys were paid a total of \$35; \$25 to Noel and \$10 to Levesque. There is no minimum age for pro boxers in Quebec, and no local commission. Both boys plan to engage in bouts this Fall."

Can anyone help verify or challenge the validity of the above information. Does anyone know of any younger pro boxers? Did either boy ever box professionally again?

SIDB

A public corporation called Sports Information Data Base (SIDB) has recently been formed. Its purpose is to create a computerized data base of all sports. It plans to sell a sports research service to the media and eventually plans to offer it to the public. It also plans to provide the facility for computerized typesetting and to publish sports books. To the best of my knowledge, none of the members of IBRO are stockholders, officers or employees of SIDB.

IBRO has been having negotiations with SIDB aimed at making IBRO the primary supplier and authenticator of historical boxing records. IBRO will continue to be conducted as a non-profit organization, but an agreement with SIDB may provide our organization with the backing necessary to produce an accurate all-time boxing record book. The utmost caution is being taken to safeguard the reputation which IBRO has established as an independent, non-commercial organization dedicated to boxing research and to producing an accurate history of boxing.

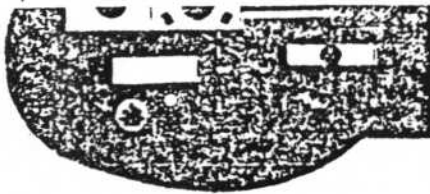

Identity problem: According to the Feb. 1928 Ring, Brown knocked out one "Jeff Smith of Mt. Holly, N.J." The question is, was this the once great Jeff Smith, or was it some other fighter using that name? In the Nov. 1926 Ring, in the Jersey Notes of Harry Dolfuss, page 32, it is mentioned that "Jeff Smith, veteran of many years, outpunched Jack Palmer, of Philadelphia." So apparently he did sometimes fight in New Jersey, during his last years.

Following is a clarification of a record book discrepancy mentioned in Newsletter # 7: George Manolian won the decision over Wolcott Langford on Aug. 30, 1927, according to the Boston Globe. So the record of Langford is wrong in the Ring and Everlast, and right in the Andrews.

JEFF SMITH (1983 RRB, page 638):

The date of his fight with Henry Lamar was Mar. 22, 1927. In the Nov. 1926 Ring, page 34, in the "Maine Musings" of R. A. Weatherbee, it is stated that "Jeff Smith, a former Maine boy, returned to Portland after a long absence and outpointed Homer Robertson" (number of rounds not stated). If this really was the same Jeff Smith, then the record book is wrong, in indicating that he was inactive in 1926, and this fight should be added to his record.

MIDGET WOLGAST had quite a few fights before 1929, besides those listed in the 1983 Ring Record Book, page 938. On Mar. 29, 1926 he defeated Billy Squires at Philadelphia, number of rounds not stated. In the September 1926 Ring, in the Southern Jersey notes of Harry Dollfus, page 31, it is mentioned that he defeated Little Jeff in 6 rounds (probably newspaper decision) "at the seashore" (probably meaning Atlantic City), and that this was his eighth straight win at that place. In the Nov. 1926 Ring, Jersey Notes, page 32, he stopped Charley Hoffman in 3 at Atlantic City. On Dec. 20, 1926 he got a newspaper win over Joe Allano at Atlantic City. In the Feb. 1928 Ring, in Ross Kauffman's Philadelphia Notes, page 33, he beat Matty White in 10 at Phila. In the May 1928 Ring, page 32, South Jersey notes, he beat Jim Griffin at Atlantic City. Also during 1928 he is said to have defeated George Burns, Jose Allano, Steve Cole, and Lew Goldberg. If any member has the Ring for the months of July through December 1928 he could help by going through the Jersey notes and Eddie Borden's Corner in the Fistic Market, the flyweight results. In the March 1929 Ring, page 21, he defeated Marty Gold, and in the May 1929 Ring, page 20, he beat Frisco Grande.

EDDIE (CANNONBALL) MARTIN had several fights in 1928 and 1929 which are not in his record (1983 RRB, pages 899-900). The one with Herman Wallace is mentioned in the April 1929 Ring, page 23, in the New York notes, the others in the issues of Jan., Apr., May, and July 1929 in Eddie Borden's Corner, in the junior lightweights.

Record book discrepancies:

In the record of Benny Ross, in the 1928 Everlast, page 144, a loss to Tiger Flowers is admitted, 6 rounds, in his 1925 losses, date and place not indicated. This fight is not in Flowers' record (1983 RRB, page 648). However, it does appear in his record in the 1926 Everlast, pp. 105-106. Date is given as Nov. 30, 1925, place Buffalo.

In the record of Dixie La Hood, in the 1928 Andrews, page 201, the last line of his 1927 record reads:

Nov. 16-Santiago Zorilla,
Wilmington (Calif.) ... 10

Result not indicated, and it is not in any other record of La Hood or Zorilla. So who won, or did the fight really take place ??

In the record of Happy Littleton, in the 1922 Andrews, page 146, a 1921 loss to Harry Greb is admitted, 15 rounds, at New Orleans, the date not given. This fight does not appear in Greb's record in that book, nor does it appear in the 1983 RRB, page 646. However, it is in Greb's record in the 1922 Everlast, page 107, but again with no month or day given.

With respect to Laurence Fielding's contribution:

NOTE ONE (to follow remark on the inclusion of Benny Ross fight in Tiger Flowers' 1925 record): "Bob Soderman's search of the CHICAGO TRIBUNE for 1925 contains a report of Flowers defeating Ross in 6 rounds, Buffalo, November 30, 1925." (L.D.)

NOTE TWO: (To follow his remarks on the record of Cannonball Eddie Martin): "I have researched Cannonball Eddie Martin's comeback activity for the years 1927-32, with the following results. L.D."
