### **Summary:**

- **The Bantamweights saw a tightly fought battle with 24 boxers receiving 50 or more points for the top 20 spots.**
- **Brazil's Eder Jofre was a runaway winner at first place garnishing 24 of 33 first-place votes. Only one voter had Jofre lower than the top 4.**
- **Mexico's hard-hitting Ruben Olivares finished in a comfortable 2nd place at 118 pounds, moving up one spot from his finish nearly 15 years ago. 18 voters had him in the top 3.**

- Panama Al Brown finished in a strong 3rd place with well over 500 points.
- Mexican-American boxer Manuel Ortiz finished 4<sup>th</sup> and was the only other boxer to finish with over 500 points.
- Mexico's Carlos Zarate rounded out the top 5 while closing in on 500 points with 484.
- American's took the next 2 spots with Pete Herman finishing 6th and power punching Terry McGovern 7th.
- Canada's George Dixon, the first black boxing champion, finished strongly in the top 10 at the 8th position. Only one spot lower than in the previous poll nearly 15 years ago.
- Danish boxer Kid Williams finished strongly at 9th with over 300 points. The same spot he finished in 2006.
- Rounding out the top 10 is Japan's Fighting Harada also finishing in the same spot as the previous poll.
- American Jeff Chandler barely missed the top 10 by 5 points, finishing in the 11<sup>th</sup>
- The rest of the voting also remains similar to the previous poll.
- The major differences being Frankie Burns just missing the top 20 as did Lupe Pintor.
- American Orlando Canizales and Thailand's Khaosai Galaxy moved up into the top 20.

**The Rules:**

**Vote for 20 fighters.**

**1 point is awarded for a 20th place vote.**

**2 points are awarded for a 19th place vote and so on, with a 1st place vote awarded 20 points.**
