Summary:

- The votes at Flyweight were fairly consistent. 28 different boxers receiving 50 or more points for the 20 spots.
- Welsh boxing legend Jimmy Wilde was a big winner among the smallest of men scoring 29 of 33 first place votes, two second place votes with only two voters giving a lesser rating.
- Pascual Perez of Argentina was a solid second place finisher closing in on 600 points.

- Filipino Pancho Villa a strong 3rd place finisher with well over 500 points. No one below the top 3 scored over 500 points.
- American Fidel LaBarba was neck and neck with Scotland's Benny Lynch with only one point separating them for 4th and 5th place respectively.
- Mexico's Miguel Canto and American Frankie Genaro were close behind at 6-7th with only 19 total points separating from 4th to 7th.
- It is interesting to note that Ricardo Lopez of Mexico and American Midget Wolgast finished in about the same spots as they did 15 years ago in the 8th and 9th positions, switching slots.
- England's Peter Kane finished in the same spot as he did nearly 15 years ago at number 10.
- Japan's Fighting Harada and American Jimmy Barry in the same relative spots finishing 12th and 13th but reversing positions.
- Newcomers are Nicaragua's Roman "Chocolatito" Gonzalez who finished 15th and Thailand's Pongsaklek Wonjongkam who made the top 20.

The Rules:

Vote for 20 fighters.

1 point is awarded for a 20th place vote.

2 points is awarded for a 19th place vote and so on, with a 1st place vote awarded 20 points.
